

## ALWAYS THANKFUL

Dear brothers and ministry partners, we greet you with love from Honduras during a National emergency. It is a difficult time for our brothers in the northern part of the country where they have been left with nothing in their hands. By the grace of God, in our Lenca area, we do not have severe flood damage that may get families at risk. However, we do have landslide problems. One of our pastors from the El Ciruelo village, Migdono, lost his house due to a landslide and at least 45 affected families there are housed in shelters. We also had problems for up to 48 hours without electricity, no communication, and obstructed access roads. Besides this, there is a lack of food, something that is a usual problem for people here.



Only by God's mercy are we good to this day. I only had an accident with the vehicle while coming from San Pedro Sula to Marcala. I had gone to leave donations for the victims when I lost control of the vehicle because of the rain. For the glory of God, my daughter Esther and I are fine, only the car was in bad shape.



I want to take advantage and tell you about some of the activities of the ministry where God has us. Now that the pandemic is over, we have started our church meetings and their activities. Among them, we had the blessing of celebrating the wedding of our brothers Mateo and Rosa.

We also visited an orphanage, a home for children who need a lot of help with clothes, toys, and food.



We have been working with the plantation and maintenance of the coffee farm and a goat project to provide for poor or chronically ill children. In the photo, doña Lorenza from the Cacahuatal village, Piraera. She is an elderly woman who takes care of her three grandchildren aged 11, 9, and 6 since her daughter died.



This year we have been challenged by God to be appointed as a work coordinator for the Lenca area, extending the work field to 5 departments in Honduras (Intibuca, Gracias a Dios, La Paz, Comayagua, and with projection to Valle). We are already working in areas with work and planning meetings, making known the mission, vision, and goals to continue carrying out the work.
