
It was a delight to gather with our family in November to witness Andrea's baptism and then a few weeks later to feast around

Gideon <sup>-</sup> told to go in his might reminds of us Jesus Christ, our Mighty Warrior King who defeated sin, Satan, and death at the cross

Jephthah <sup>-</sup> the only one to rightly declare, "the LORD, the Judge" pointing to Jesus Christ, the true Judge over His people (Rev. 2-3)

Samson <sup>-</sup> set apart from birth to save his people...

"Minor" Judges - who, like the genealogies, remind us that despite the Garden curse (death), life continues on in anticipation of the promised seed, Jesus

"The darker God's people are seen to be, the brighter God's grace shines out!"

A favorite of mine this time of year are the lights, especially on our tree and outside as we have no streetlights, and it gets dark in our "neck of the woods"! But I really only enjoy them when in the darkness...

Darkness. Right at the beginning. "...darkness was over the surface of the watery deep".

We're wrapping up our fall study of Judges and it's horrifyingly dark! Certainly not the material for a "Hallmark" Christmas movie and yet...I've come to conclude that these chapters bring clarity, light, to Christmas.

Salvation through judgement is on display in Judges and brings to mind these truths:

- "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; a light has dawned on those living in the land of darkness." Isaiah 9:2
- "This is the judgement: the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than the light because their works were evil." John 3:19
- "You are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." Matthew 1:21 "In Him was life, and that life was the light of men. That light shines in the darkness,
  - and yet the darkness has not overcome it." John 1:4-5
- "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him." John 3:17
  - "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!" Mark 1:15

Judges ends with, "In those days, there was no king in Israel; everyone did what was right in right in his own eyes" after beginning with "the Israelites did what was evil in God's sight" (2:11). We've come to see that they did what was wrong in the eyes of God because they did what was <u>right</u> in their own eyes. They stopped and forgot to keep looking to their Savior and Rescuer ("I am the LORD your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery"!!!) In the darkness, I am reminded again of my own Gospel Amnesia, that "failure to live in light of God's salvation and grace" and my need to repent and believe this good news that has come in Jesus Christ, the Light of the World!

Thank you for continuing to support us through your prayers and giving these past few months - the confidence in God's providing displayed through these means is such an encouragement. We humbly admit that we are incapable of doing this on our own as we so easily can turn from God just as the Israelites did time and again. Continue to pray for us that we would be obedient, trusting, dependent while holding fast to him as we face the future with courage.
