For the Jack family here in Michigan, February is proving an eventful month. First, our recommended support level has improved to the point where leadership approved us to definitely plan on moving to the Bible college (Wisconsin campus) this summer to resume ministry there in the fall. Another \$400 per month will get us up to the 70% target, but that is a lot closer than the \$2000 per month we were falling behind a year ago! Second, our oldest moved out and is looking for a steady job in southern Michigan; he has odd jobs for now that do not require mask-wearing. Third, we are close to finalizing plans for Christina to start college in the fall; she wants to train as a nurse.

Recently while reading in Exodus, Andrea was challenged by the contrast between fearing change versus trusting God to have a better plan through the changes. Our Bible Institute graduates serving remote people groups have likewise wondered how young churches would fare when missionaries had to evacuate their host countries during the pandemic. Some have been able to return (after thorough testing and quarantines, of course); and guess what? Church leaders in one location greeted their returning missionaries with news that 99 people had trusted Christ and been baptized in December! Another missionary couple in the Asia Pacific region writes, "2020 was a great year for the Buru believers! Church services were held in homes for much of the year. Leaders gained experience in leading worship that they would not have had if we had met together."
