Rearview Mirror Snapshots (pre-Christmas Timesaver)

2020 January: News of the worldwide coronavirus pandemic hits national news.

February: Ministry travel plans scuttled because public meetings were canceled. First great-grandson born. Oaklin Will Schiffner. Joy!

March: LaNay's (Crystal's special needs sister) apartment complex goes on "lock down." So, she packs up to live with us for four+ weeks.

April: LaNay's caregiver suddenly resigns and Crystal became her full-time helper.

May: The caregiver agency for LaNay tells us that many of their employees have resigned. Would Crystal be willing to be hired as LaNay's support personnel? Blink. Yes! Then Crystal's 92-year-old Aunt Evelyn in California lets us know she thinks it is time to move to Arizona to be near us. June: 5-5-5 For about 5 weeks, we traveled between Mesa and San Clemente, CA, every 5 days for 5 days of work. We readied Aunt Evelyn's townhome for sale, listed it with a realtor and moved all her belongings to a storage unit in Mesa. Nevertheless, we managed a brief visit in the Midwest to see some of our kids and grandkids. Sweet! Maximised a lengthy layover by meeting with a potential large donor for Ethnos360.

July: Aunt Evelyn moved into our spare bedroom while her CA house entertained the looky-loos. Mean-while we shopped for a place for

her near us. Crystal starts to clue into the increasing need of providing assistance.

August: An offer for the California house was accepted making way to move forward on a townhome three miles away from us.

September: The California house finally closed as did the purchase of the AZ townhome. The move in process began. Normal enough, but the previous owner left it fully furnished.... Ocober: Aunt Evelyn's level of care increased to the point we hired in-home helpers for 12-hour day shifts. Despite Crystal caring for both LaNay and Aunt Evelyn, *Reach UP* goes to print.

November: The week of Thanksgiving LaNay contracts the covid virus, so we moved her back into our spare bedroom Within a couple of days both Crystal and David are battling the illness as well.

December: All three of us were sick for about three weeks. December 9 Aunt Evelyn falls while at a doctor's visit and breaks her leg in two places. She is in the hospital for a week and then moved into skilled nursing. LaNay is able to move back to her apartment before Christmas.

February: At a checkup appointment, Aunt Evelyn passes out and is rushed

back to the hospital for another 5-day stay.

March: The rehab location kindly, but adamently suggests that we must find a "more permanent"



facility for Aunt Evelyn.

April: We were able to move her into a beautiful care home that would allow us to visit as long as we maintain regular covid tests. Crystal and LaNay's step-mother loses her battle with cancer.

May: We discuss the decision to list our home for sale to capitalize on the current market value and rent Aunt Evelyn's empty townhouse. We find time to work on the soon-to-be-released grief journal.

June: We were blessed to travel to the celebrations of two of our grandkids' high school graduations. David spoke for a men's conference while at the Ethnos360 missionary training center. We pulled the plug and put our house up for sale upon arrival home. In the blazing Arizona heat we move most of Aunt Evelyn's belongings back into storage and as much of our belongings as possible into the townhome. A big shout-out to our nearby fellow missionary for helping in a big way.

July: Our house sold and closed August 13.
