The first thing is, the payment for my sin—Jesus already took it! So I don't have to pay for my sin. My sin debt is gone. That is the first big thing that I have. The second thing that I have is Jesus' righteousness! God looks at me and I am His friend. I will be forever with Him! So why do things of this ground matter? It's nothing! I already have what I need."
