At the fair, a young mom came into the tent with her five-year-old daughter and asked if we still told children about God. I said, "Yes, we do! Where were you when you asked Jesus to be your Savior?" She quickly answered, "Right here in this tent when I was a young girl." She wanted her child to come to the same tent where she had come to know the Lord Jesus.

Our theme for the week of club was discovering clues from God's Word about Jesus. The missionary story was Mary Slessor who lived an exciting life in Africa. Every day I left Mary in danger and said this sentence, "You have to come back tomorrow to find out what happens." The kids would sigh and question me why I would do that to them every day. They wanted to know instantly what happens. We enjoyed being at the fair again with children running to the tent to get their arm painted while hearing The Wordless Book story. We were able to give out a Wordless Book bracelet and tract to each one as they left the tent, also a Jesus DVD, Bible, and devotional book.
