I have some very sad news to share. Fernando and Gaby, Loving Well facilitators in Argentina and co-laborers with Shepherd's Heart Mission Associates Carlos and Chelita, lost their 11-year-old son, Benjamin, to cancer this past week. When we met them last summer in Colombia they were so excited to be partnering in marriage ministry. Carlos and Chelita's daughter was married on April 6. Carlos officiated the wedding and hours later the funeral. Joy and pain were coupled together with close their friends. This is truly "loving well".

Bejamin's death was sudden and unexpected. From diagnosis to passing it was less than a week. He leaves behind two younger brothers.

Mary is continuing chemotherapy with the strongest chemo dosage behind her. She is now in the second phase with 10 more weekly infusions, followed by daily radiation for 4 weeks. So far she is tolerating the treatments, though she finds it all very exhausting. We look forward to the end of July when she completes this regimen.

The Men's Story group finished at the end of March and those who completed the time bonded over vulnerable sharing and a commitment to trusting God for redemption of damage that the enemy planned to limit their impact. They desire to continue to meet for mutual encouragement as they press on.

Tomorrow, April 17, I depart for Hungary. It has been 5 years since my last visit. I am anxious to see the friends that we met with for over 13 years. I have been scheduling meetings and realize that every day will be full. While there I will be one of the speakers at a conference on abuse, sponsored by an organization called "Life from the Ruins". I will be speaking on Rebuilding Broken Walls. Mary's sister will be with Mary while I am away. Please hold this trip in your prayers, along with each of the things shared above.
